The main benefit of switching to First:Utility is in its use of new technology to save households money over time and not just when consumers switch.

One of these money-saving measures is the installation of a free 'smart meter', which reports energy usage back to the supplier as well as the household, effectively ending the days of estimated bills.

Chris Eagle, commercial manager of Energy Choices says: "It's great to see that these independent suppliers are upping their game and keeping the 'big six' UK energy companies on their toes. We think that smart meters are a fantastic idea for households who want to keep an eye on their energy consumption, and anything the suppliers can do to save customers the stress of receiving incorrectly high bills is a massive step forward. We would still advise consumers to [compare energy prices](#) first to see who are the cheapest suppliers for them but in the long run this will potentially save you as much money on your bills."

The government has pledged to roll out these 'smart meters' nationwide by 2020, but the First:Utility plan to install these meters for every 'iSaveV2' customer is the first of its kind.

Until their new meter is installed, 'iSaveV2' customers can benefit from a £20 annual reward for entering their meter readings online every quarter. They will have to manage their bills online and pay monthly. After a year of Direct Debit payments, dual fuel customers will be eligible for a discount of 12.5% on their bills.
